Times Grand Prix at Riverside with drivers like Dave MacDonald with the first Cobra win (who had moved to L.A. after getting out of the US Coast Guard in Hawai'i) in CSX2026, Ken Miles in CSX2002, Bob Bondurant, Alan Ford GT and sending the molds for shaping in England.

Also, in 1963 in Los Angeles, song writer Carol Conners met

Shelby and considered writing a song about the Cobra. She asked him if he would give her a Cobra one if it became a hit single. Carroll dared her to do it. Carol and her brother, Marshall, came up with "Hey Little Cobra" in the 1960s surf music style of the Beach Boys and Jan and Dean



Grant, Lew Spencer and Dan Gurney. Back in Dearborn, Ford was completing the design of the (young members ask your elders who they were). Studio musicians include Glen Cambell (guitar) and Bruce Johnston (backing vocals) who went on to perform with the Beach Boys, Leon Russell (piano) and



While the song only hit number 4 on the music charts, (one of the highest for hotrod car tunes), Carroll consented and gave her a new Cobra #CSX2067. It ran poorly and was swapped for CSX2544. Carol's brother borrowed the car, got ahold of the title and then sold it without her permission. Another true Los Angeles drama story. SHELBY AMERICAN TO HONOR CARROLL SHELBY WITH CENTENNIAL EDITION 2023 SHELBY F-150 SUPER SNAKE TRUCK Article Reprint - Oct 2, 2023 TEAM SHELBY News by SAI – JohnE

Las Vegas - October 2, 2023 -Executives with Shelby American, a wholly owned subsidiary of Carroll Shelby International Inc. (CSBI:PK), issued a "last call" to honor the company's founder with a commemorative truck by introducing a Carroll Shelby Centennial Edition Shelby F-150 Super Snake. The stunning truck, which honors Carroll Shelby, was introduced on Friday, September 29 during the annual Team Shelby Bash in Las Vegas. Only 100 of the four door 800* horsepower 2023 Carroll Shelby Centennial Edition Super Snake

trucks will be built. Special Edition Shelby F-150 Super Snake celebrates Carroll Shelby's passion for trucks:

- Only 100 will be offered for the 2023 model year
- Features most street-legal horsepower of any Shelby street-focused truck yet
- Shelby trucks available for order through select Ford dealers

"Throughout his life, Carroll Shelby tinkered with anything that had wheels to maximize performance, including trucks," said Gary Patterson, president of Shelby American. "Carroll especially enjoyed driving performance trucks on the street. In fact, he drove pickups more often than any other vehicle during his last few years of life. It's fitting that our final build to honor him will be the <u>Carroll Shelby Centennial</u> <u>Edition Super Snake F-150</u>."

Carroll Shelby had a long history with performance trucks and SUV's; he experimented and built various models over the years. That interest led to many influential truck programs and the introduction of the offroadoriented Shelby F-150 Carroll Shelby Centennial Edition pickup in 2023.

"The demand for the lifted, high-

performance Centennial edition Shelby F-150 was extremely strong, leading to a rapid sell out of the special edition trucks," said Vince LaViolette, Shelby American Vice President of Operations and Chief Designer. "At the same time, fans of the lowered street-focused Shelby Super Snake F-150 began to clamor for a Centennial Edition truck. We took the same approach to this commemorative model by adding more power, increasing the stopping power and giving it the distinctive Shelby good looks. The result is a fast four-door street truck with the awesome capabilities that Carroll Shelby expected. Having spent so many years working directly with him, I'm confident Carroll would be proud of this truck."

The 2023 Ford F-150 is based on the Lariat 4x4, 5.0-liter SuperCrew, the 100 Centennial Edition trucks come standard with 400 standard horsepower; and an optional supercharger boosts the V8 engine to 800* horsepower. The heavy-duty suspension and underbody of the Carroll Shelby Centennial Edition truck were built to handle the street with a Shelby by Ridetech Suspension System featuring adjustable FOX coilover shocks and new upper control arms up front while FOX adjustable Shocks, a new sway bar and track bars keep the rear in place.

A total of 100 four-door Centennial edition trucks will be built for the US market. Starting MSRP for the truck is \$127,995 (naturally aspirated) and \$136,995 (supercharged); they have a 3 year/36,000-mile warranty including powertrain. Each Carroll Shelby Centennial Edition Shelby F-150 Super Snake includes membership in Team Shelby, the worldwide club established in 2008, and will be eligible for documentation in the **Shelby** <u>Registry</u>. The package includes the same style black Stetson hat that Carroll Shelby wore. //



WEEKEND MECHANIC HARRY AND MELINDA ZISKO

BACK FROM THE DEAD

Harry Zisko's '68 Cali Special starts, runs, rolls, and stops. What's next?



Aloha everyone. Some of you have been asking for an update on the GT/CS. Well, actually, only Larry has been asking for this, but since he volunteered to be editor I'll help him out and provide some info.

Just as a reminder, I'm in the process of resurrecting my 1968 GT/CS (aka California Special) after 14 years of slumber. With a LOT of help from Vince, we got it running (change of oil, spark plugs, new carb and some other things), and got it



stopping (basically everything in the brake system except for the hard lines was replaced with quality rebuilt parts plus much improved friction material). So, it made it through the Safety Check, and I got it registered after paying a large amount to the State for late registration fees (no, I was not smart enough to turn in the license plates).

Great! Now I can start driving it! Except that it kept overheating. Expecting a large amount of trash in the cooling system for sitting so long, I had put a filter in the upper radiator hose to keep the trash out of the radiator. Unfortunately, there was enough trash to plug the filter. Twice. The first time I pulled out the AAA card and had it towed home (oh, the embarrassment of bringing my pride and joy home on the back of a tow truck!). The second time I let it cool off enough that I could remove the filter, then filled up the system and drove it home.



WEEKEND MECHANIC CON'T

The next order of business was to flush the cooling system. There seems to be only one place onisland that will actually flush a



cooling system (not just drain and refill), and they did not have a worker to do this. So, it was up to Vince and me. Two flushes later, I had 30 gallons of contaminated water to figure out what to with, and there was still trash in the system. The system was also showing signs that I was getting combustion gasses in the coolant.





Tests to prove this theory failed, so last Saturday, Vince and I pulled the heads to see what we could see. Unfortunately, what we saw was not good. As part of rebuilding my engine 24 years ago on the mainland, I had all of the cylinders sleeved, and on Saturday, we found that two of the sleeves had shifted / slipped. Not good, and probably the source of the combustion gasses getting into the cooling system.

My neighbor, who is an old-time hot-rodder, gave good reviews of a local machinist, so I went and talked with him. And he could not guarantee that he could fix the problem (basically, the previous machinist botched the job badly).

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So, it was now time to look for a new block. Fortunately, new member Chris Hirahara had the engine he had just removed from his '68 Cougar. I brought the engine home, and Vince and I tore into it. We removed the heads and everything looked good in the cylinders. We also popped off a main cap and one rod cap, and they looked very good too. Darryn came by and we




removed the reciprocating assembly to get the block ready to be baked for cleaning - the first step in the rebuild. Lots of decisions to be made on which cam and heads to use going forward.

That's where I am right now. If Larry whines enough in the coming months, I'll provide another update. //

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The Original Rice Krispies Treats Recipe

Ingredients

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Last year, the Original Venice Crew (OVC) built its first GT350 Roadster as a prototype for what is planned as a 24-car production run; this was based on an idea by one of the co-founders of the OVC, Jim Marietta. While on a tour of the East Coast, the car made an appearance at the MCA's race to Indy National where MCA President Jeff Mays drove it on the Putnam Park Road Course, accompanied by OVC handler Miles Cook.



Marietta and partner Ted Sutton worked for Shelby American in the early 1960s and were intimately involved with the development of the competition GT350 at Carroll Shelby's first shop at 1042 Princeton Drive in Venice, California, thus the name "Original Venice Crew." While Marietta and Sutton are the face of OVC, the company represents everyone who worked there (30 or 40 other guys who won numerous world championships for Shelby American).

The GT350 Roadster incorporates designs from two very well-known and well-respected automotive designers—Peter Brock and Camilo Pardo. The GT350 Roadster is similar to the OVC GT350R but tamed for street use, including an automatic transmission, improved front suspension, and four-wheel disc brakes, along with convenience items like air-conditioning, power steering, and Bluetooth radio. Marietta estimates horsepower at 460 at the crank. A 500horsepower "competition" engine is available, as are other options like manual transmission, enhanced chassis bracing, and OVC's independent rear suspension, which is based on the design tested by Shelby American in the 1960s. Wimbledon White with blue stripes is the standard



color combination, with black and gold also available.

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Michael Graves is the MCA Hawai'i representative.
