VA Sets all-time records for care and benefits delivered to Veterans in 2023



Record accomplishments for Veterans, their families, caregivers, and survivors in fiscal year 2023 include:

- Delivered more than 116 million health care appointments to Veterans, surpassing the previous record by more than 3 million appointments.
- Delivered \$163 billion in earned benefits, including \$150 billion in compensation and pension benefits, to 1,535,685 Veterans and survivors.
- Processed 1,981,854 Veteran/survivor claims, surpassing the previous record by 15.9%.







Getting hands dirty to make the Ala Wai clean



Members turned out on Saturday, Nov 18, to volunteer for the Genki Ala Wai Project, a long-term endeavour which aims to clean up the Waikiki canal to the point of being fishable and swimmable again.

One way to achieve this is the construction of "Genki Balls," which are a mixture of soil, rice husks, and a special broth of microbes all mixed to form a mud which are then formed into fist-sized balls which are then dried for a few weeks,





then tossed into the canal. The microbes then consume the water's pollutants.

The activity is held once a quarter. Kids from McKinley High, Hawai'i Baptist Academy, community individuals, along

with Aloha Mustang members turned out for the Saturday session - over 70 people in all. Contact Chris and Jade DeBone to volunteer, both whom introduced this project to the club.

compared to O'ahu because everything is shipped in, That's OK, when you're on vacation. Haha.



The Mustang GTD was born from the concept of the Mustang GT3 race car. The GTD will be the pinnacle of the Mustang racing lineup that includes the GT4 and GT3, as well as the upcoming Dark Horse R spec racer and more. The GTD name refers to the IMSA "GTD" racing class for cars that are built to FIA GT3 technical regulations. The Mustang GTD was designed and engineered as a collaboration between Ford and race partner Multimatic.

Like the 1965 Shelby GT350s, Mustangs destined for GTD conversion will leave the Ford assembly line as "knock-downs." Mustang GTD was developed by many of the same



people involved with the Mustang race cars and the LeMans-winning Ford GT. It will be the most powerful and quickest road-going Mustang ever. Production numbers haven't been released, with Ford stating that a "limited" number will be built.

The rumor mill predicts 1,500. The GTD price tag will start at a

staggering \$300,000, with options taking the MSRP beyond \$400,000. The GTD is a two-seater because the rear seat area has been removed to save weight and provide space for the rear suspension. The cockpit is finished in premium materials, including Miko suede paired with leather and carbon fiber, while digital displays keep the driver engaged and Recaro seats optimized for track days are complemented by available paddle shifters and rotary dial shifter, all made from retired Lockheed Martin F-22 titanium parts.
